PREPARING FOR YOUR VISIT

Whilst the workshops are entirely self-contained, making students familiar with the story of 'The Ramayana' before the workshop may help them to feel more confident in the sessions.

Our workshop leader will bring everything they need with them to the session. All we ask from schools is an empty hall and bundles of enthusiasm!

WHAT TO EXPECT!

Each workshop starts with some movement games, often involving steps later to be found in the set material. Children will then learn a dance, retelling The Ramayana from beginning to end through movement. Depending on age there is opportunity for movement suggestions, pair work and group work.

The workshops focus on the importance of imagination and storytelling. You can be anywhere in the world, in your school hall and wearing your school uniform, but with a little help from your imagination you can be transported to another place.

HOW TO USE THIS PACK

Before the workshop we suggest using the plot synopsis to familiarise yourself and your class with the story.

Please feel free to explore any and all of the suggested activities contained within this pack. The activities have been divided into sections based on activity type, rather than ability level, as many are adaptable for different ages.
